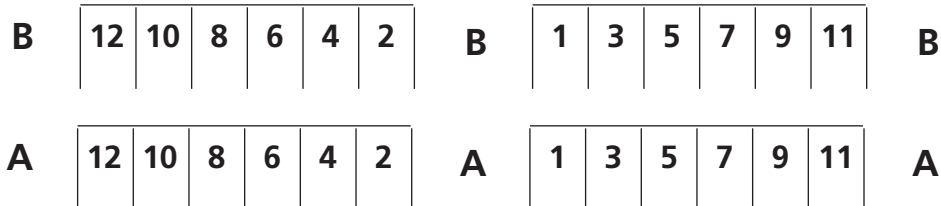


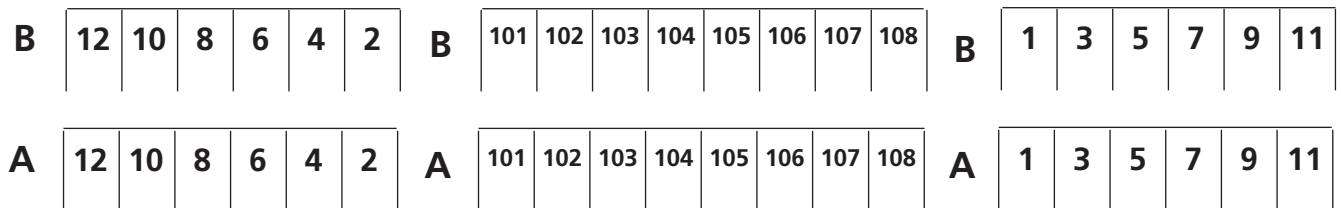
# *Installation Details*

## *Common Number & Letter Schemes*

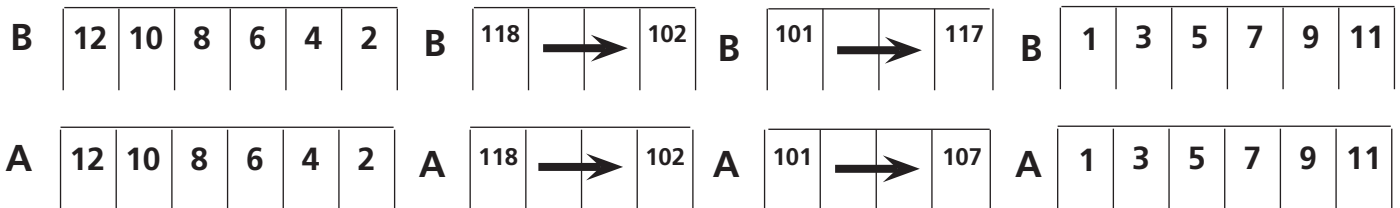
### 1. Two Banks of Chairs:

### 3. Four Banks of Chairs:



This system can be expanded further, depending upon the number of chair banks on the layout, by using 200's, 300's, 400's, etc.

This is the most widely accepted system of numbering and lettering of auditorium chairs. Irwin Seating will use this system unless asked to use a customer's own system. Beware of special number and letter plates, as they need to be ordered and are costly. Also avoid the use of the letter "l" as it tends to look like a number 1 (One) when printed on tickets.

If the "New York" system is not to the customer's liking, they should feel free to submit their own system and Irwin can apply it to the applicable seating layout.
